ibuprofen 600 MG Tabs

Commonly known as: MOTRIN

Last time this was given: 600 mg on 9/12/2016 10:17 AM

Take 1 Tab (600 mg total) by mouth four times daily

lisinopril 10 MG Tabs

Commonly known as: PRINIVL,ZESTRIL

Last time this was given: 10 mg on 9/12/2016 10:18 AM

Take 1 Tab (10 mg total) by mouth daily

oxyCODONE-acetaminophen 5-325 MG Tabs

Commonly known as: PERCOCET, ROXICET

Last time this was given: 1 Tab on 9/12/2016 10:18 AM

4 Take 1 Tab by mouth every 4 hours as needed for severe pain (7-10/10)
