

- Surgical bypass


Carotid artery disease

Salem Health provides therapy for carotid artery disease using multiple treatment options including:


- Carotid endarterectomy
- Transfemoral carotid artery stenting
- TCAR procedure (TransCarotid Artery Revascularization) minimally invasive carotid-based stenting with flow reversal.



Salem Health also offers carotid artery duplex screening and surveillance in our IAC accredited vascular laboratory.
